City Manager Edward R. Henkle, who received a written complaint from Hall, said the public works department will improve the appearance of the dump by grading the slope in the background. He said city crews have been directed to burn trash only when the wind

Henkle pointed out that about a year ago the city entered into a contract with a firm which engages in rodent control. It treats the dump occasionally. He says the park affords the most suitable place for dumping tree stumps, brush and other articles which cannot be handled at the incinerator plant.
